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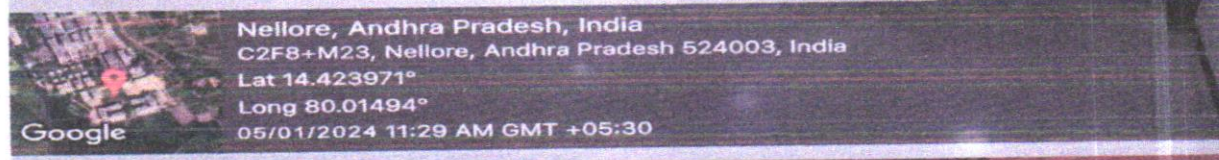
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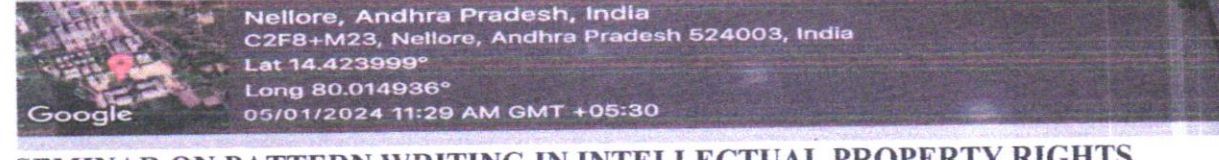


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WORKSHOP ON GOOD CLINICAL PRACTICE

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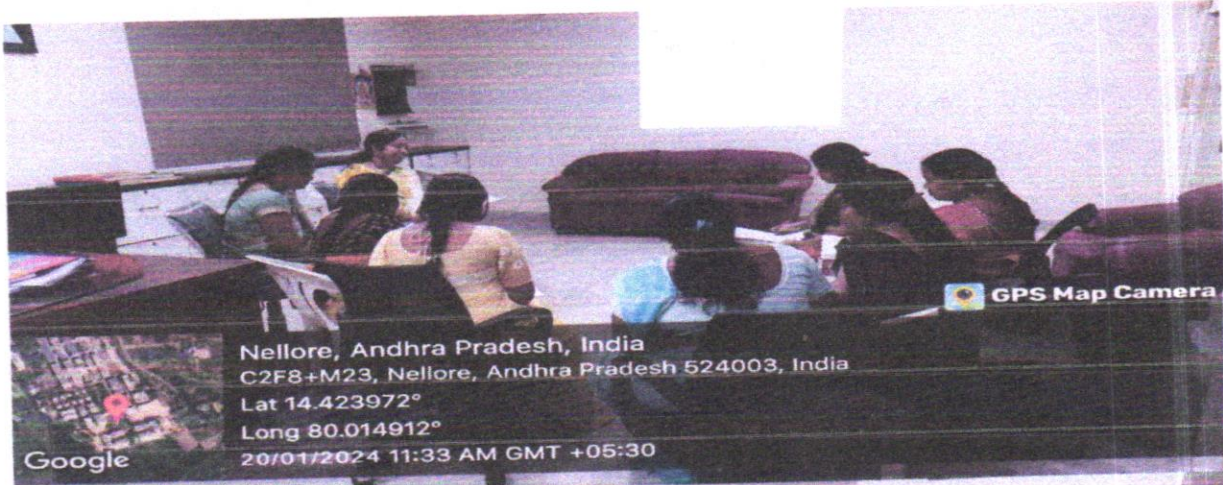
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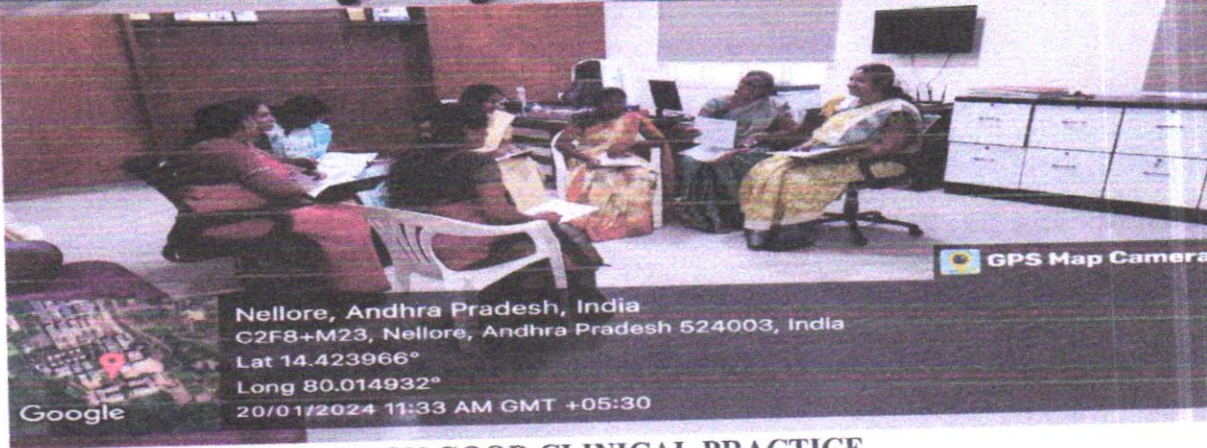
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SEMINAR ON QUALITY ASSURANCE IN CLINICAL LABORATORIES

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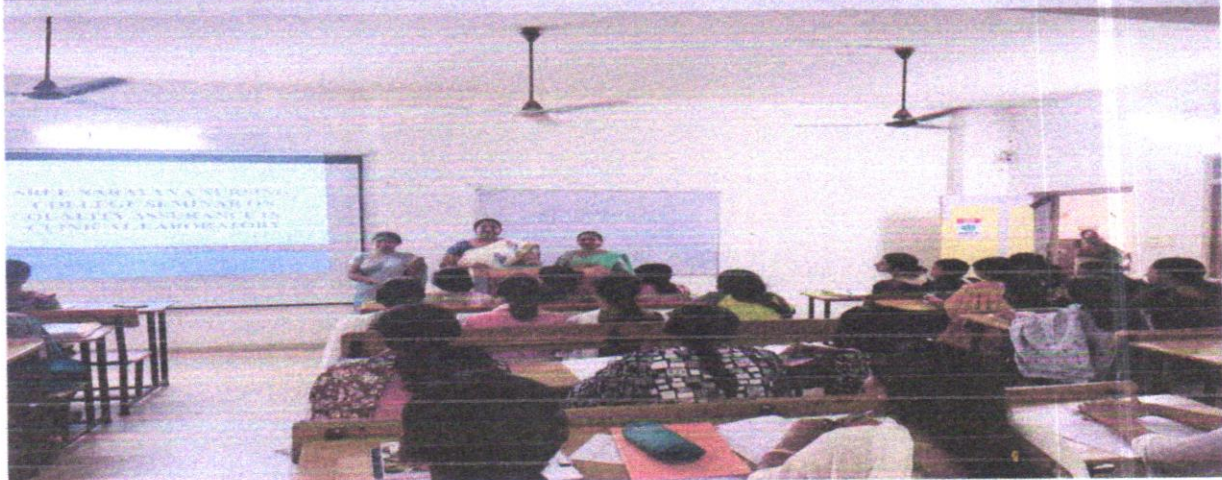


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WORKSHOP ON EXPERIMENTAL RESEARCH DESIGN

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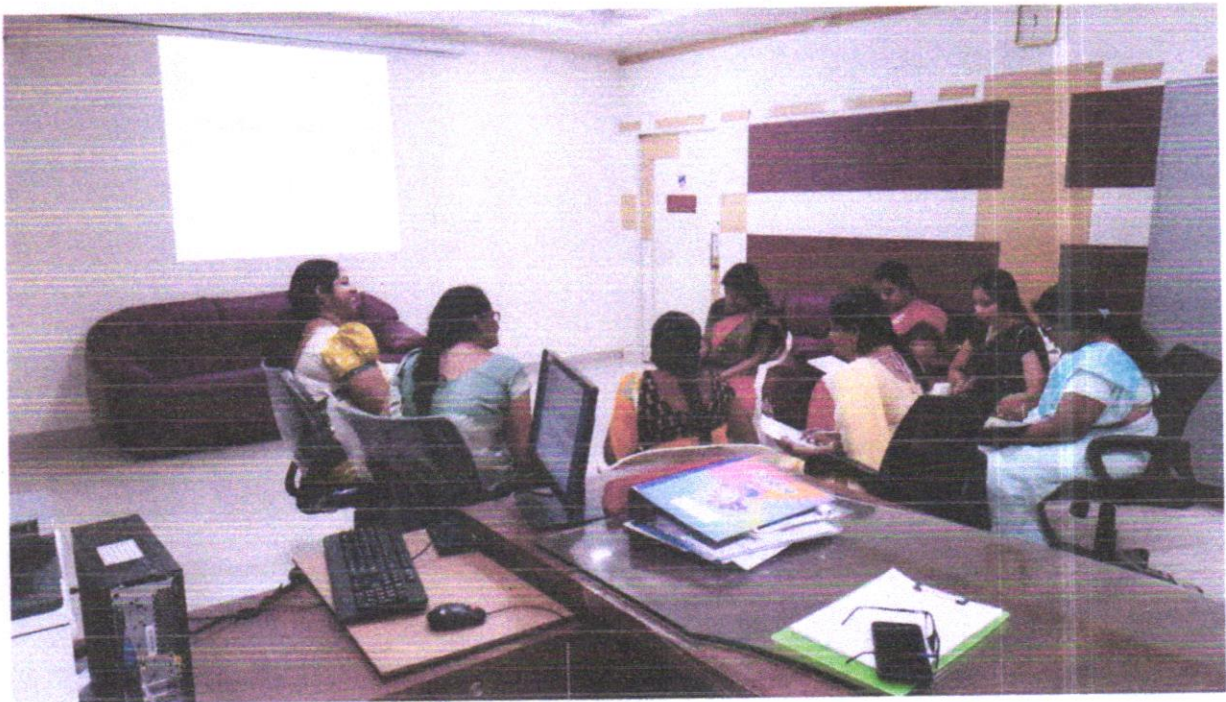
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WORKSHOP ON UPDATED RESEARCH PRACTICES

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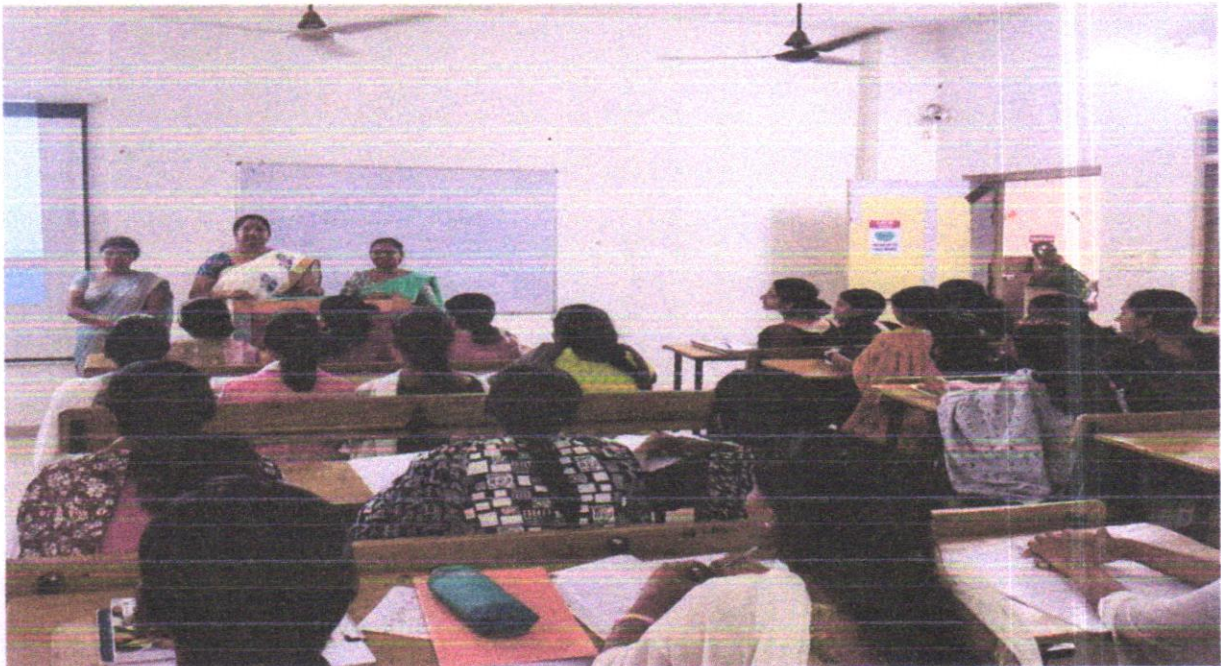
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WORKSHOP ON SYNOPSIS WRITING
